In case you missed it, please be aware of the following RE National dues:

"After careful consideration, the ANG Board of Directors has decided to move forward with a change in how our annual dues will be paid. Beginning in January 2022, all membership dues will be paid on an annual basis, in January. This applies to all memberships of 1, 2, 5 and 10 years duration and in all countries. If your membership renewal date is between October and December 2021, please pay your annual dues as usual. In 2022, all membership dues will be paid in January, and will be prorated to account for the new annual schedule.

This change will provide benefits to ANG in reducing the time and effort spent in managing the dues renewal process, providing more timely information for budgeting purposes, and simplifying the membership verification process for chapters.

From my design archives, this pattern was first published in 1999! Aspen works up as a 4-1/2" across diamond-shape for an ornament or it can be turned on its side to use as a 3-1/4" square.

Aspen was designed for #18 mono canvas but by scaling up (or down) the weights of your threads you can work on any mesh size. As an ornament, it's a great way to use up or experiment with a variety of threads and color combinations. Since much the canvas shows through the stitching, colored canvas is an excellent choice for the base. Two or more solid colors can be used, or an overdyed thread in place of the Confetti combined with a contrasting, solid color perle or even floss. Gold or silver metallic accents go with any color scheme, or use the metallic to add another color. I'd love to see what you create!

Materials needed for one 4-1/2" wide diamond-shape ornament are listed below. Stitch count is 80 x 80.

Zweigart #18 mono canvas in Sage Green, cut 8" by 8"

2 skeins #208 Juniper SJ Designs Confetti (if you're very careful you may be able to get by with 1 skein!)

1 (10m) reel 002 Gold Kreinik Fine (#8) Braid

1/2 skein #504 Light Green DMC Perle 5

1 package #58 Gold or #58H Gold Hex-cut SJ Designs Size 15/0 beads (Hex beads have extra sparkle!)

#20 and #22 Tapestry needles

#10 Tapestry Point Beading needle (or a #10 Between needle)

Invisible (clear nylon sewing) thread or floss (DMC #504 or same color as your canvas) to attach the beads



Begin at the center of the design with the cluster of **Leaf** stitches. Moving outward, work the *Confetti* and Perle 5 stitches first, then add the metallic stitches. When stitching the *Confetti* rows, be sure to work continuously around the diamond shape rather than stitching each quarter separately; this takes advantage of the subtle shading created by the *Confetti*. Attach the beads after all the stitching is completed; the beads in the **Byzantine** stitch row are attached with **Half Cross** stitches. To control the slant of the bead, the **Half Cross** stitch should slant in the opposite direction that you want the bead to slant. The beads between the **Flat** stitches are anchored by bringing the needle up in the canvas hole, threading a bead, then going back down into the same canvas hole.

As charted, *Aspen* can be used as an ornament or a small boxtop. By adding more rows it can easily be enlarged to whatever size you like.

MORE SUGGESTED COLOR COMBINATIONS:

#203 Wisteria Confetti with 002 Gold Braid and White Perle 5 on Antique Blue canvas with #1858 Gold galvanized or #1858P Gold-plated beads.

#111 Pineapple Ice *Confetti* with 015HL Chartreuse Braid and Ecru Perle 5 on Sage Green canvas with #1816 Gold Silver-lined or #18128 Antique Gold Silver-lined beads.

#102 Strawberry Ice *Confetti* with 002 Gold Braid and 902 Garnet Perle 5 on Pink canvas with #1813 Ruby Silver-lined or #1899 Wine Iridescent Silver-lined beads.

#110 Crystal Ice *Confetti* with 002 Gold Braid and your favorite blue or green shade of Watercolours[™] used 1-ply (in place of the Perle 5) on Victorian Green canvas with #1811H Hex-cut Crystal Iridescent beads.

Taping the edges of the canvas will help prevent snags in the *Confetti*. Stretcher bars or a working frame are recommended to prevent distortion; otherwise blocking may be necessary. *Confetti* is colorfast and can be handwashed in cool water with a mild sudsing agent.
