November Study Topic – Blackwork Bookmark

Learn how to finish the bookmark with Nun stitch and fringe the ends.

Prep for It's a Mystery. Tips:

- Make several black and white copies of the pattern and use colored pencils/markers to determine color placement.
- Once you have decided where each color/thread will be used, write them in the directions where they are used.
- Don't hesitate to change/unstitch something if you don't like the way it looks.

How to Use Wired Flair https://chillyhollownp.blogspot.com/2008/09/how-to-use-wired-flair.html I knew that you could thread a metallic braid through Flair to make your own version of Frosty Rays, but it never occurred to me to thread wire through it. Great way to do smoke or steam. If you read the comments below Jane's blog, you'll see that some people are threading wire through Kreinik braid. This would only work with larger braids but is a good solution if you need to put curves on a piece.

Bountiful Harvest Bookmark

DESIGNED BY PAM KELLOGG

STITCH COUNT: 24W X 100H OR ABOUT 2" X 8"

Materials needed:

- Kreinik Very Fine #4 Braid 221 Antique Gold
- Kreinik Silk Mori: 2013, 2015, 2063, 2066, 4033, 4034, 6086, 6106, 6107
- 24-count stitchband in white (Zweigart brand)
- #24 Tapestry needle
- scissors

Instructions:

Each square on the chart equals two fabric threads, so stitch this design over two threads centered on your stitchband fabric. Use two strands of Silk Mori or one strand of Braid according to the color key. Use One strand of Braid or Mori for backstitching.

Color Key:

- 🔀 Very Fine #4 Braid 221 Antique Gold
- Silk Mori 2015 Medium Dark Gold
- 🙎 Silk Mori 2013 Light Gold
- silk Mori 2063 Light Pumpkin
- 💌 Silk Mori 2066 Dark Pumpkin
- Silk Mori 4033 Light Kelly Green
- Silk Mori 4034 Medium kelly Green
- Silk Mori 6086 Dark Grape
- M Silk Mori 6106 Dark Lavender
- Silk Mori 6107 Very Dark Lavender
- Backstitch with #4 Braid 221
- Backstitch curly q's and stems near pumpkin with Mori 4034
