Nametag

Since we have new members, it is time to start wearing our nametags at meetings and when we are stitching in public.

November Study Topic - Diagonal Stitches and Cross Stitch Samplers

We will use one or two of ANG's Holed Up Minis (https://www.needlepoint.org/page/HUMs) to apply what we learned from the October meeting. The patterns are Diagonal Stitches Sampler and Cross Stitch Sampler by Marilyn Owen. The patterns are attached at the end of the newsletter. The dimensions are about 3x3 inches.

You will need a piece of 18-ct canvas and threads from your stash. Try to find an overdyed thread that has at least 3 colors, then look for threads that complement the colors. You will use the threads to stitch one or both samplers and play with color combinations.

December, January, February Study Topic - Summer Fireworks

Summer Fireworks is by the same designer as Autumn Fireworks [Beautiful Stitches in Australia (http://beautifulstitches.com.au/)] and uses similar materials. We will not be teaching the project, per se, but Robin and Cindy will talk about the project and help with the stitches as needed. The instructions are attached.

The stitched area is about 2.5" x 8.5". The designer suggests adding about an inch to each side, but you may want to add more depending on how you want to finish it. (Minimum size would be about 4.5 x 10.5", 1" added to each side; for framing, add 2-3" to each side.) You will need to mount the Congress cloth on stretcher bars so you'll want to round up.

It is stitched on Congress cloth using stranded silk and cotton threads. You will need an overdyed thread with at least 3 colors in it, plus 4 solid-colored threads that coordinate with the colors in the overdyed thread. You can use any colors you like. You can use all cotton, all silk, or a combination. Note that you will need an additional color if you want to use the same threads as for Autumn Fireworks (this is a good time to practice what you learned about color in October).

Michael's carries a good selection of DMC's Color Variations and Coloris threads. Congress cloth, thread, and stretcher bars can be ordered from Fiberworks in Waverly - https://www.myfiberworks.com/.

You should have your Congress cloth mounted on stretcher bars before the meeting so you are ready to stitch. Please read through the instructions before the meeting.

You could also choose to stitch the project on a different ground cloth, e.g., 18-count canvas or linen. Watercolors and pearl cottons would work well on 18-count canvas.

Blue Ribbon ANG Website

Our website (https://www.blueribbonang.com/) has a Members only page. When you go to the website, you'll see a Log In button to the right of ANG. Click on that and follow the instructions. Cindy Baldwin must approve access. Once you are approved, the last page on the website is Members. Click on that to add information about yourself.

Hover over Members and you'll see Files. You'll see several folders, including Study Topics. Patterns and information for past study topics are saved here. Anyone can create folders and add files. If you have questions, ask Cindy.

Future Study Topics

A tentative schedule for future study topics is provided below. This is based on the quasi poll that we did during the June meeting.

March, April – Fantastique, a pulled thread and blackwork design by Elizabeth Almond. We will spend 2-3 meetings on this. You will need to purchase the pattern, but the cost is only about \$5 (+/- a bit depending on the exchange rate). You can purchase the pdf pattern at https://www.blackworkjourney.co.uk/projects2.html (scroll down to Fantasteque [yes, it is misspelled on the website] and click on Add to Cart). She will send you the pdf chart via email.

The project is stitched on linen and is a combination of blackwork and pulled thread with a few surface stitches. The instructions call for 28-count linen, but you could use any count linen or evenweave, Congress Cloth, or even 18-count canvas. You will need an overdyed strandable thread and a coordinating solid color and some beads. The outline is traced onto the fabric before stitching.






Design Size 54 x 54 threads

Use as a notebook sampler, keeping the stitched piece with the stitch diagrams for future use.





