Tentative Study Topic Schedule

May – Beaded Needleminder – beading around a cabochon, part 1. The kits will be approximately \$10 and will include a cabochon (12 mm diameter), 11/0 and 15/0 seed beads, foundation material, thread, needle, backing, 2 rare earth magnets, and instructions. Color choices are shown in the photo; choose silver or gold seed beads. Let Cindy know what color you want at the meeting or by email if you won't be at the April meeting.

June – Beaded Needleminder – finishing, part 2



July, August, September – Hardanger Star. Fiberworks will order kits for us, but Robin needs to know no later than April 30 if you want a kit. She will let Karol know how many kits to order. When they are in, you will be responsible for contacting Karol with payment and shipping information. The cost of the kit is about \$15.00. The kit includes enough material to make three stars, but Robin will only teach one.



April Study Topic – *Dreaming of Spring*

Continuing *Dreaming of Spring*. You will find the pattern in the January 2016 issue of *Needle Pointers*, pages 18-25. The motifs in the pattern are very adaptable to other uses such as bookmarks, baby items, and hand/kitchen towels. Perle 5 works well on the aida bands inset into towels.

Robin has found two errors in the pattern:

- Bed F The leaves and stem are not charted correctly in the fourth row from the bottom. In the model there is no single stitch in the middle. Robin decided to stitch this row as a straight stitch over 5 threads.
- Bed G According to the model the third row is missing a stitch, it should be stitched over 4 threads, under 2 threads, over 1, under 1, over 1, under 1, over 1, under 2 then over 4 threads.

Future Study Topics

Directions to North Liberty Public Library


520 W. Cherry St, North Liberty, IA

A Carolyn Mitchell Design for Rainbow Gallery



122 x 56 threads

MATERIALS

10" x 6"—#18 Mono Canvas (color to match if possible)
Stretcher Bars to fit; Laying Tool, such as a Trolley Needle
#22 and #24 Tapestry Needles; Felt (lining & pages);
Sewing Thread

2 cards Overture®—V97-Nevada

1 card Ultra Suede®—U02-Ecru

2 cards Neon Rays®—N56-Lite Blue


2 cards Gold Rush 18™—GD35C-White Gold


Measure up $1\frac{1}{2}$ " from the bottom and in $1\frac{1}{2}$ " from the left hand side of the canvas.

- ENLARGED HUNGARIAN—Use Neon Rays. Follow Diagram #1 for count and Master Chart for placement.
- 2. MILANESE STITCH VARIATION—Use 1 ply of Overture and work on the diagonal following Diagram #2. See Master Chart for placement.
- 3. SMYRNA CROSS—Use Gold Rush 18, following Diagram #3 for count.
- **4. RICE STITCH**—The large cross is worked first with Ultra Suede. Cross the arms with Gold Rush 18 as shown in Diagram #4.
- **5. BINDING STITCH**—Fold over canvas leaving 2 mesh on all sides. Finish with the binding stitch. Work all sides. See Diagram #5 for count. Fold the center 2 threads that were left between back and front. Stitch them according to Diagram #6. Trim back canvas to 3 threads.
- **6. FINISHING**—Cut felt to fit inside of needlecase. Cut as many pages as you would like approximately 1" smaller than backing. Sew the pages down the center of the felt to backing. Sew felt to inside of needle case using the binding stitch for sewing.




DIAGRAM #2
Milanese Stitch Variation









DIAGRAM #4—Rice Stitch
