March and April – *Dreaming of Spring* from *Needle Pointers* January 2016, Pages 18-25 (pattern darning) May – Beaded Needleminder – beading around a cabochon, part 1 June – Beaded Needleminder – finishing, part 2 July, August, September – Hardanger Christmas Ornament

#### March Study Topic – Dreaming of Spring

Dreaming of Spring is a pattern darning project by Susan Jones. It was inspired by art-nouveau cross stitch motifs from vintage charts. You will find the pattern in the January 2016 issue of *Needle Pointers*, pages 18-25. The design calls for congress cloth, but it could be stitched on 18-ct canvas or linen with some changes in threads. The called-for threads are Gumnuts Yarns Buds, which are about equivalent to #8 perle. The Gumnuts threads have some variation in color, but you could certainly use solid colors.



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## MARCH - SHAMROCK

Stitch count: 44h x 44w – approx. 3"h x 3"w  $\heartsuit$  28ct Old Lace Country French linen from Wichelt (#86-269) stitched over two. or 14ct Old Lace Country French Soft Touch Aida (#367-269)

- FT4 Soft Sheen Fyre Werks<sup>®</sup> Loden Green 1 strand H630 Hi-Lights Antique Gold – 1 strand
- S809 Spiendor<sup>®</sup> Dark Purple 2 ply
- S1049 Splendor<sup>®</sup> Brass − 2 ply

P76 Pebbly Perle® Dark Olive – 1 ply

After completing all cross stitches, back stitch with 1 strand Antique Gold Hi-Lights around the edge of the main design area as indicated by the solid line on the chart. Attach the round 4-leaf shamrock charm where indicated by the large circle in the upper right corner with some of your Dark Purple Splendor<sup>®</sup>. (charm #80135AG from By Jupiter!)
